

# ■ REVENUE IS NEEDED TO SUPPORT OUR SCHOOLS, COLLEGES AND COMMUNITIES!

**Our Commonwealth must continue to be a great place to live, work and raise a family. We need excellent schools and colleges, affordable health care for all and a strong economy that provides good jobs.**

## WHAT THE BILL DOES:

Raises the state income tax rate from 5.25 percent to 5.95 percent while substantially increasing the personal exemption to ease the impact on the middle class.

Raises the state tax rate on interest, dividends and long-term capital gains from 5.25 percent to 8.95 percent while cushioning the impact on middle-class seniors and disabled people. Low- and moderate-income families typically will either be unaffected or will pay less under this plan. Middle-income families will see little change overall, with some paying more and some paying less than under the current system. Those with the highest incomes will pay the most. The steepest increases will affect the top 1 percent of families – those making more than \$580,000 a year.

- ❑ **THE PROBLEM:** When our communities thrive, we all thrive. But our communities are struggling after several years of budget cuts brought about by the loss of revenues from the recession and from unaffordable tax cuts enacted over many years. We must continue to invest in what matters: our schools and colleges, our health care, our drinking water, our roads and our public safety systems. To help our communities thrive, we need a tax system that is both adequate and fair.
- ❑ **OUR SOLUTION:** The Campaign For Our Communities, a coalition that includes the MTA and many other organizations, supports *An Act to Invest in Our Communities* (HB 2553/SB 1416). The legislation would raise more than \$1.3 billion in the first full year it is implemented from those most able to pay while having a limited impact on middle- and lower-income families. We need these funds to restore important programs and live up to our commitment to our students. Our kids deserve a well-rounded education that includes music, art, athletics and extracurricular programs.
